Investment Policy





Fund Manager Comments

Financials reversed the previous month's losses in September, as the Federal Reserve's decision not to reduce the monthly amount of securities purchases that it undertakes, so-called tapering, stunned markets. This resulted in a sharp reversal in the recent falls in emerging markets and real estate stocks but profit taking in US banks, in particular those that are the biggest beneficiaries of rising interest rates. Better than expected economic data and the decision not to launch an airstrike on Syria by the US also helped sentiment.

In what was a very good month for financials, performance was held back by the strength of sterling relative to other currencies. The only real disappointment was the performance of US banks which fell by 4.2% (although in US dollars they were marginally up). Elsewhere, European and Asian banks performed well rising 2.7% and 1.8% respectively. Real estate stocks recovering from some of their recent losses also performed well. Against this background the Trust's net asset value rose by 2.0% outperforming the MSCI World Financials Index by 1.1%.

We visited the Philippines, Thailand and Hong Kong during the month and we returned feeling largely reassured. In the Philippines macro indicators remain strong, with the country running a current account surplus. The banking system remains flush with liquidity, benefiting from the recent relaxation of special deposit requirements by the central bank, and overall lending growth is reasonable in the mid-teens percentage growth per annum. The principle negative which explains our limited exposure at present, despite the very favourable macro trends, is the very high valuations attached to banking stocks.

Thailand came under considerable pressure in the recent sell-off. The level of consumer indebtedness is relatively high and has not been helped by a recent government incentive program for first-time car buyers. The biggest impact has been on used car prices which have fallen sharply and makes us wary on some of the smaller consumer finance stocks that are heavily exposed to car finance loans. Our only holding, Siam Commercial (Thailand's largest bank), should be largely unaffected. The feedback from meetings with banks is that liquidity conditions remain strong and although loan growth is slowing, most continue to be comfortable about the outlook.

September is peak conference season for the financial sector with two in London (which we attended) for European financials (hosted by Bank of America Merrill Lynch and Keefe Bruyette Woods) and two in the US (hosted by Barclays Capital and Keefe Bruyette Woods again). Recent relative performance of European financials has been strong. In particular, European banks are benefiting as institutions have upped their exposure to the sector reflecting the more positive fundamentals, namely stronger balance sheets and recent better economic data.

The two London conferences gave us the opportunity to catch up with a lot of banks in a very short time frame but we also managed to have meetings with a number of North American financial companies whose management passed through our offices during the month. In particular we had a very good meeting with PNC, which is our largest holding (it is the seventh largest bank in the US by assets or fourth by branches and for historical reasons is the largest shareholder of BlackRock, the asset manager). We think the shares continue to look attractively priced and offer the prospect of much higher capital returns over the next twelve months.

During the month we sold our remaining holding in Raiffeisen Bank, having reduced the holding in August post a sharp run-up in its share price, on the back of weaker operating trends and continuing concerns over its relatively weak capital position. The Trust issued 6.3 million new shares during the month and we used this opportunity to increase holdings across the portfolio but in particular in ACE (US property & casualty insurer), Discover Financial Services (US credit card issuer) and to a lesser extent City of London Investment Group (emerging markets fund manager) the latter post a positive investor day.

We also purchased a new holding in Sparebank Nord-Norge (Nord), a small Norwegian savings bank that operates in Tromsø in the northern part of Norway, taking advantage of the weakness in its share price post its decision to raise further capital. The region in which Nord operates is a big beneficiary of recent oil and gas finds in the Barents Sea, which will boost the local economy. The announced rights issue upset some shareholders resulting in the fall in share price to a level where it looks anomalous as its shares are trading at more than a 20% discount to book, which is a discount to other Norwegian savings banks and a very large discount to the larger Scandinavian banks.

We highlighted in last month's factsheet that we had made a very small investment into an AIM listed vehicle, W&G Investments (W&G), that was one of three bidders for the 315 branch network that Royal Bank of Scotland was being forced to sell. W&G's bid was unsuccessful (losing out to a private equity consortium) but as the amount raised was very small (as it was only sufficient to cover due diligence costs), so the 'loss' to the Fund is likely to be negligible (estimated to be only 1 basis point).
